

The Port Adelaide Sailing Club conducted a working bee on September 23rd. in preparation for Opening Day. We have 98 Marina berths and approximately 25 boats in the hardstand. Each of these boats has an owner. Every one of these boat owners would have received notice of the working bee, but only a few deigned put in an apology for being unable to attend due to other commitments. The usual dozen or so people attended the working bee which was very disappointing, even though everything on the 'to do' list was eventually completed. We thank those that attended and appreciate your commitment to the Club.

During the clean-up around the Club on the working bee, a container of used engine oil was discovered on the marina. This is a potential source of pollution and should never be left on the marina or the club premises. A bucket containing two bottles of oil was also found in the workshop, one of which didn't have a top on it. We have also found other waste oil around the Club because people are too lazy to dispose of it properly. This is totally unacceptable and reflects a culture which will not be tolerated in our Club.

You are reminded of the following extract from the Club's 'Maintenance and Slipping Policy'.

"Members/Contractors are to ensure all general waste and recyclables are placed in the bins provided. Other waste, including waste oil, solvent/paint residues and old batteries and tyres, must be removed from Club premises by the boat owner or contractor."

Further to this, old batteries and flares may be left outside the Sailability shed for recycling but waste engine oil and coolant can be disposed of

PARKING AT THE PASC

Many members have raised concerns regarding vehicles parked in non-designated parking areas of our club. It would be a timely reminder that all members respectfully adhere to our club constitution and only parked in designated car parking areas.

On occasions where the Members car park is full please use the parking areas between the Girl Guides and PRSC and access the club via Champagne Alley. This area has the capacity to park over 80 vehicles. As a reminder our Club Rules state:

- 2.18 Except as allowed by Regulations 2.20 or 2.21 a member or visitor to the Club may park a vehicle only within marked bays in the car-park.
- 2.19 At all times whilst parked any bay marked for 'Disabled parking' a vehicle must have a valid parking permit displayed.
- 2.20 A member overnighting on their vessel in the marina in accordance with these regulations may between 1800 hours and 0800 hours the next morning park their vehicle between the shed and the marina revetment wall providing that vehicle access to the eastern gate is not impeded at any time.
- 2.21 Between 0800 hours and 1800 hours on any day the area between the shed and the marina revetment wall is reserved for loading and unloading vehicles only, with no vehicle remaining there for more than fifteen (15) minutes.

Whilst the management committee does not wish to enforce rules that are not adhered to there continues to be members that ignore requests and notices about parking. This leaves the management committee having to reconsider how to manage parking for the benefit of all members. As a guide please:

- Do not park in the Hard Stand area unless you are working on your boat in that area and your vehicle can be shifted quickly (i.e. within 5 minutes). The hard stand is for boat and trailer storage only, not vehicles.
- Only park in areas designated for car parking. That is the large area on the North-eastern side of the club as you enter the gates and the 3 short term (15 minute) parks by the marina ramps.
- Do not park in the designated 'Disabled parking' spaces unless you display the appropriate parking permit issued to you or one of your passengers.
- When there is no parking available use the spaces outside the club perimeter.

This information is provided to all members in the interest of harmony and good relations between one another. The rules are in place to ensure this outcome. However, we accept that some rules may not be in the interest of all. If this is the case members are encouraged to put in place action to have rules amended, changed or deleted if they are unsuitable in the current form. Information on how this may be enacted can be obtained from any member of the Management Committee.


